The verb *to do* collocates with a great number of nouns and in those collocations it takes on different meanings. For example:

- ❖ We'll have to get someone *to do the roof*. (= to mend the roof)
- ❖ Your team *did the flowers* for our wedding on 17th January. (= arranged the flowers)

To do is the most usual verb for talking about tasks and duties, and for talking about producing something using our hands, our mind or our skill.
