A & an – indefinite article

The indefinite article in English is an important part of speech because it introduces a noun phrase and implies that the thing referred to is non-specific. Typically, it is used to introduce new concepts into a discourse.

- ❖ Below are some examples of when we use the indefinite article.
- 1. Before a singular countable noun which is mentioned for the first time and represents no particular person or thing.
- We are staying in a very good hotel tonight.
- We recruited <u>a</u> new CEO, who used to work for <u>a</u> competitor.
- $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ producer must not place $\underline{\mathbf{a}}$ product on the market unless it is $\underline{\mathbf{a}}$ safe product.
- 2. Before a singular countable noun which is used as an example of a class of things.
- $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ business plan is a written document that describes your business.
- $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ holding company is a company which owns a controlling interest in another company.
- A good hotel can make your trip special.
- 3. Before names of professions.
- She works three days a week as <u>a</u> secretary for the firm.
- I'm an accountant working for a small company.
- A formal education is not always necessary in order to become <u>a</u> professional photographer.
- 4. Before certain numbers (*hundred*, *thousand*, *million*, *etc.*), before *half* when *half* follows a whole number and before fractions.
- About **a** third of the budget is spent on aid to poor regions.
- The company plans to layoff more than a hundred employees effective January 1st.
- Employees are entitled to two and $\underline{\mathbf{a}}$ half days of holiday a month.
- 5. Before expressions of price, speed, ratio, etc.
- The excess baggage is charged at 4 pounds **a** kilo over the 20kg limit.
- According to the manufacturer, diesel engine emits only 119g/km of CO2 when driving at 62 miles **an** hour.
- Working 55 hours **a** week is a requirement for a well-paying job.
- ❖ The choice of the indefinite article (a or an) is based on the pronunciation of the word that follows the article

We use $\underline{\mathbf{a}}$ before a consonant sound and we pronounce it as /9/.

- ScotAsh is <u>a c</u>ompany that recycles coal ash into building products.
- The new collection embodies quality and style with a special attention to detail.

We use **an** before a vowel sound and we pronounce it as /ən/.

- If you have been hurt in an accident, you might be entitled to make a compensation claim.
- Solar panelling is a lot more cost effective than many people think, producing **an i**mpressive amount of electricity.

Be especially careful with words beginning with o, u or h, or with abbreviations.

- H&M is asking consumers to bring in their used clothes to <u>an H</u>&M shop. /ən/ + /ei/
- I completed an MD in the University of Dundee as a Clinical Research Fellow. /ən/ + /e/
